RESOLUTION APPROVING THE FIRST REVISION TO THE COMMUNITY-BASED JUVENILE DELINQUENCY, SUBSTANCE ABUSE, AND GANG PREVENTION PLAN FOR FISCAL YEAR 2014-2015 AND AUTHORIZING ITS SUBMISSION FOR STATE APPROVAL AND IMPLEMENTATION (YOUTH SERVICES-JUVENILE CRIME PREVENTION COUNCIL)

WHEREAS, on June 23, 2014, the Forsyth County Board of Commissioners adopted a Resolution Approving the Community-Based Juvenile Delinquency, Substance Abuse, and Gang Prevention Plan for Fiscal Year 2014-2015 and Authorizing Its Submission for State Approval and Implementation; and

WHEREAS, the Forsyth County Juvenile Crime Prevention Council's original funding plan included an unallocated amount of \$10,523 of FY 2014-2015 Juvenile Crime Prevention Council Funds which were reserved for future needs; and

WHEREAS, any Juvenile Crime Prevention Council funds which remain unallocated at the end of the calendar year will revert to the State; and

WHEREAS, a revised plan was approved by the Forsyth County Juvenile Crime Prevention Council's Allocations Committee on November 3, 2014 and later approved by the full Juvenile Crime Prevention Council of Forsyth County to allocate the remaining \$10,523 to Partnership for a Drug-Free NC, Inc. (Insight Human Services Program) for the provision of additional juvenile psychological services; and

WHEREAS, the Forsyth County Juvenile Crime Prevention Council hereby submits the revised funding plan with the allocation of \$10,523 to Partnership for a Drug-Free NC, Inc. (Insight Human Services Program) for additional juvenile psychological services for fiscal year 2014-2015 to the Forsyth County Board of Commissioners for its approval;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Forsyth County Board of Commissioners, having reviewed the recommended revision to the community-based juvenile delinquency, substance abuse, and gang prevention plan approved and submitted by the Forsyth County Juvenile Crime Prevention Council and finding it acceptable, hereby approves the said revised plan and further authorizes the plan to be submitted to the North Carolina Department of Public Safety, Division of Juvenile Justice for final approval and subsequent implementation for fiscal year 2014-2015.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman of the Forsyth County Board of Commissioners is hereby authorized to execute all necessary documents to submit and implement the attached revised funding plan.

2014-2015 Allocation Recommendation

Upon completion of the allocation process for the 2014-2015 budget year, the JCPC recognized unallocated funds in the amount of \$10,523. The committee recommended to Commissioners that the funds remain in the JCPC budget unallocated until a need could be identified. On November 3, 2014, the JCPC agreed that the need for psychological evaluations for youth entering into the Juvenile Justice system was greater than anticipated. As a result, the JCPC recommends that the funds in the amount of \$10,523 be allocated to the Partnership for a DrugFree NC (Insight Human Services Program) for the purpose of psychological services.

Total available for distribution: \$10,523.00

On November 3, 2014, per the recommendation of the Allocation Committee chaired by Sharon Singletary, it was recommended and approved by the full JCPC that the funds be allocated to the Partnership for a DrugFree NC (Insight Human Services) for the purpose of psychological services.
