Meeting Called to Order

A regular meeting of the Forsyth County Board of Elections was held in the elections conference room on December 10, 2013. The meeting convened at 4:32 PM, Chairman Ken Raymond presiding.

Approval of Minutes

Chairman Raymond requested that the Board members discuss the minutes of November 5 amendment, 12, 15, 21 and 27, 2013. Secretary Russell discussed an amendment for the Board minutes of November 21, 2013. Secretary Russell moved and Member El-Amin seconded a motion to amend the Board minutes of November 21, 2013 to clarify a statement that the results of the Precinct 091 – Tobaccoville Community Center recount on November 21st were different from the prior November 15th recount in that it gave Steve Wood one fewer vote.
