Strategic

Program Updates

- NCFast conversion of FNS cases is progressing quickly. FNS workload is treading water and 4 staff from other program areas have been assigned to help. Agency may propose a plan to use half of the temp staff to remain after conversion to assist with related needs.
- NC legislature is considering moving 4 million dollars of Smart Start subsidy funding to DSS. The NCACDSS supports this move but Joe is neutral due to the excellent working relationship Forsyth DSS has with Smart Start.

Economic Services Future / Organizational Changes

• The agency continues to move forward with coming massive organizational changes due to ACA and NCFAST.

Business Office

Medicaid Transportation – it appears the state will not move to a statewide broker thus local DSS role remains the same.

Adult Services

NC's settlement with DOJ regarding housing placement of individuals with a mental health and/or developmental disability diagnosis may be about to cause new and unbudgeted county expenditures for Special Assistance. Staff will monitor and advise the board as needed.
